Intermediate Sewing: Casual Jacket

NOTE: DO NOT CUT FABRIC before the first class. The first class will start with a fitting session. Wear what you would normally wear under a jacket.

If we have time after the fitting, you will sew samples of flat fell seams, so be sure to bring your machine to the first class. We will talk about layout, cutting and interfacing. You can buy fabric and interfacing during or after the first class. If you have some already, bring your fabric and interfacing to the first class.

PATTERN: See pictures on p. 2

Your pattern comes from your instructor. Please let us know your choice by the weekend before class. Send your choice to info@portlandsewing.com

BUY FABRIC:

Buy the amount of fabric suggested by the pattern for your size **plus 1/2-yard extra** to allow for shrinkage. Choose a midweight (8 oz.) denim, twill, linen, velveteen, corduroy or synthetic suede (not velvet, ultraleather or pleather). Do not buy large plaids, stripes or patterns that need matching. Buy a stretch fabric only if you are an experienced sewer. **NOTE:** Pre-shrink and iron fabric (except for synthetic suede) before class. Preshrink twice if you have a stretch fabric.

Don't buy interfacing until after the first class.

– **Buttons.** Buy the number suggested by the pattern.

BRING: A sewing machine in good working order and your machine manual and attachments. Don't forget your buttonhole attachment!

<ul style="list-style-type: none">– *Thread to match– *Size 12 or 14 Schmetz Universal machine needles for lighter fabrics.– Size 16 or 18 Jeans or Universal machine needles for heavier fabrics– *Fine pins with glass heads, 1-3/8"– *Pin cushion or magnetic tray– *Tape measure– *Shears—one for paper, one for cloth– *Small scissors or nippers– *Chalk pencil or water soluble pen– *Seam ripper– *Seam gauge	<p>Optional equipment:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">– Awl & hammer for bachelor buttons– Snap-setter (if you buy snaps)– *Jean-a-ma-jig or 2"x4" cardboard– *Buttonhole punch– *Topstitching thread to match– *Size 14 or 16 topstitching needles <p><i>* = Items available at Portland Sewing.</i></p>
